They should not be allowed to take local voter approved funding outside of the district. Any money allocated to fund retirement should go to retirement and not to the pocket of the charter schools	Involuntarily Deferred
HB 101	EDWARDS SCHOOLS/CHARTER	Requires charter school teachers to meet same certification requirements as other public school teachers	We agree. The attempt to distinguish charter schools as anything but public schools, when they are funded with taxpayer money, is ridiculous.	Not on Agenda for 04/23
HB124	SMITH, PATRICIA SCHOOLS/CHARTER	Provides relative to employment eligibility requirements for teachers in charter schools	This bill is not as strong as HB 101	Involuntarily Deferred

HB 127	HARRISON SCHOOLS/ST SUPERINTDT	Provides for election of the state superintendent of education	We agree – in addition to making the state superintendent elected, this sets the salary for the position as the same salary as all other statewide elected positions at \$115,000. HB 184	HAVARD SCHOOLS/CHARTER	Provides relative to assets or property acquired or used by charter schools under certain circumstances	We agree - Charter Schools are funded with taxpayer money, therefore any assets aquired should remain the property of the public	Involuntarily Deferred
HB 192	PEARSON SCHOOLS/CHOICE	Provides relative to the Student Scholarships for Educational Excellence (voucher) Program, including scholarship amounts, funding, and eligibility requirements for kindergarten students	We disagree - Removes the requirement for kindergarten enrollment since they are no longer "getting around the constitution". MFP funding for the vouchers is not constitutional so "other" money will be used.	Involuntarily Deferred

HB 533	SEABAUGH TEACHERS/EVALUATION	Prohibits the inclusion of test scores of a student who has excessive absences in the value-added model for purposes of teacher evaluations		

HB 701	EDWARDS SCHOOLS/CHOICE	Provides relative to student eligibility for vouchers	We agree – If the purpose of the voucher is to address failing schools, then they should be applicable only to failing schools.	Involuntarily Deferred
HB 702	EDWARDS SCHOOLS/CHOICE	Provides relative to eligibility of kindergarten students for participation in the voucher	We disagree – This bill is changing the requirement that only children in the RSD will be eligible for Kindergarten vouchers. It does restrict the vouchers to D and F districts only. But we disagree with expanding the program.	Not on Agenda for 04/23
HB 703	EDWARDS SCHOOLS/CHARTER	Prohibits the State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education from authorizing charter schools under certain circumstances	We agree – Although we disagree with the whole premise of Charter Schools, if we are forced to have them by Gov. Jindal, they should only be allowed in “failing” school systems.	Reported Favorably
HB 816	BARROW SCHOOLS/DISTRICTS	Requires that the Recovery School District provide advance notice to contractors when decisions have been made to cancel contract	We disagree - These types of provisions should be provided for in a contractual agreement and not mandated by law. HB 836	HARRISON SCHOOLS/CHOICE	Requires the state Dept. of Education to develop an accountability system for nonpublic schools participating in the voucher program and requires compliance with the system by such schools	We agree – Although we know that the purpose of the voucher is the government takeover of private schools, if private schools want to accept taxpayer money, they should be held accountable. If they don't want the interference of government, then they should NOT take the voucher.	Involuntarily Deferred

Appel, this is a necessary move because "petty" and "selfish" parents don't want this, so voluntary just doesn't cut it. BESE has no purview over anything but Elementary and Secondary Education. By setting parameters with the use of the word "unless" this bill merely outlines the requirements that must be met in order to do so.	Not on Agenda for 04/23
HCR 2	PIERRE TEACHERS/EVALUATI ON	Repeals a State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education rule	We agree - If BESE adopts a rule that is illegal, it should be repealed	
HCR 46	NORTON TEACHERS	Amends a State Board of Elementary and Secondary Education rule relative to planning time for teachers	BESE does not even have the authority to manage to affairs of the local school districts.
